COVID-19: Medical Examiner-Coroner response to the pandemic

As COVID-19 swept through the world, the Department of Medical Examiner-Coroner swiftly responded to the challenges posed by the pandemic, and immediately prepared for the potential fallout.

At the outset, the Operations Division secured extra refrigerated storage to increase the department's body capacity from 500 to 2000. The



supplemental refrigerated storage is a permanent resource the department - and the region - will have if a surge of deaths or catastrophe were to occur in the near future.

Additionally, with the discovery of earlier coronavirus-related deaths in February, the state petitioned medical examiner offices to test decedents who died between December 2019 to March 2020. The request was meant to determine if COVID-19 related deaths may have been missed in the

months leading up to the pandemic in California. For several weeks, Medical Examiner-Coroner personnel have been working closely with the Department of Public Health to select appropriate cases and submit samples for testing to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Established by the Board of Supervisors in 1984 as a function of the Quality and Productivity Commission, the **Productivity Investment Fund (PIF)** program is used to help departments jump-start pilot projects, develop creative strategies to enhance delivery of services, improve the effectiveness and efficiency of operations, and produce cost savings and/or generate revenue.



The Commission solicits proposals each quarter and carefully reviews project merits in a three-step vetting process before approval.
